Focus area


Explicit teaching of expected behaviours

School achievements:

- ---> 49% reduction in behaviour incidents between 2018 and 2023
- 58% decrease in School Disciplinary Absences (SDA) between 2018 and 2023
- ••• 85% of students responding to universal support in 2023 (0-1 major referrals for behaviour)
- ••• 10.6% increase in students who agreed that "The expectations and rules are clear at my school" in 2023 School Opinion Survey
- ---> PBL Tier 1 fidelity benchmarks achieved (Tiered Fidelity Inventory)
- ••• substantial improvements in Effective Behaviour Support Survey results between 2020 and 2023.

Strategies implemented:

- ----> behaviour data analysed and used to develop a behaviour curriculum
- -----> professional development for staff in how to teach expected behaviour explicitly
- ••• professional development for staff to increase capability and understanding of trauma-informed practices
- allocated time for explicit teaching of expected behaviours within timetable
- ---> targeted and intensive student support systems established
- behaviour expectations communicated to whole school community
- ---> regular data collection and monitoring of implementation.
